Charles Robert Darwin was an English naturalist. He is famous for his work on the theory of evolution. His book *On the Origin of Species* did two things. First, it provided a great deal of evidence that evolution has taken place. Second, it proposed a theory to explain how evolution works. Evolution and natural selection are the key to understanding the variety of life on Earth. Darwin spent almost five years on board a Royal Navy exploring ship. He was the guest naturalist, which meant that he was responsible for making collections and notes about the animals, plants, and the geology of the countries they visited. The ship's crew made charts of all the coastal areas, which could be used by the navy wherever it went in the world.
